South George Mason Drive Multimodal Corridor Study Update

The [South George Mason Drive Multimodal Corridor Study](#) has progressed to Phase II, the project team is currently working on corridor-wide concepts which align with the Arlington County Master Transportation Plan.. The project team is currently analyzing community feedback and there were about 400 unique users who submitted over 600 comments to the online web map. Thank you to all Douglas Park residents who shared their feedback. The goal of the study is to develop a corridor-wide profile and initial concepts for each segment - Arlington Blvd to Columbia Pike, Columbia Pike to Four Mile Run, and Four Mile Run to Leesburg Pike. Additionally, a preliminary design concept will be developed for the segments located between Columbia Pike and the County line for use in upcoming grant funding applications. Upgrades Coming to Two Douglas Park Parks

Two neighborhood parks are getting ready to receive some much needed renovations: Monroe Park and Douglas Park (our neighborhood’s namesake). In the next few months, residents will have the opportunity to provide feedback to Arlington County as the Department of Parks and Recreation prepares to rehabilitate the parks. Monroe Park will be the first park to be updated, and it will retain the playground for ages 2-5 and an open multi-use space. Douglas Park will take more time and be more involved because of it’s size and amenities.

If approved in the Fiscal Year 2023-2032 Arlington County Capital Improvement Plan, Douglas Park will receive \$1.8 million in development funding for design and construction of renovation improvements, which include replacement of the picnic shelter, one pedestrian bridge, site furnishings, site circulation,

stormwater management improvements, invasive plant species removal in the forested area and reforestation plantings. The playground, which was last replaced in 1996, will be revamped at a later date.
