# Thank You Douglas Park for Another Successful Holiday Fund Drive

Thank you to all of the Randolph neighbors who made the Douglas Park Civic Association Holiday Fund Drive a great success again this year. This program, which has been going strong for over 25 years and is an integral part of DPCA annual activities, gives a hand to needy families at Randolph Elementary School. Each year DPCA works with counselors and teachers at the school to identify families who are in severe financial need. Neighbors generously contribute their time, money and efforts to help. In terms of outreach, this was our biggest year yet; we helped seven families, with a total of nine adults, and sixteen children, ages four through seventeen. Because of the generosity of DPCA members, their holiday seasons were much brighter.

This year we collected just under \$2,500 in donations, and had an outflow of just over \$3,000. So we ran a little short, but luckily had some funds available to cover the deficit. Thank you to everyone who so generously contributed.

All families received many gifts, including necessities and special treats. The children were given clothes, pajamas, coats, and shoes in addition to books, toys, games and other wish list items. Parents were given coats, hats and gloves, and household goods such as pots and pans, and even a microwave. The families were very grateful for the gifts and sent thank you cards to express their appreciation. They said: "Thank you for all the presents. This means a lot to us. We appreciate everything that you have given us. Thank you!" And, "We would like to tell you of the tremendous gratitude that each of us has in our hearts for all of the gifts we received. Words fail to express how grateful everyone in the family is for these beautiful gifts. They brought immense joy to our children. On behalf of our entire family, thank you for this beautiful surprise. Wishing you a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year." And, finally, "Many thanks. To kick-off 2016 on an especially positive note, we're thrilled to announce that Patrick Henry Elementary School has once again been named a Title I Distinguished School by the Virginia Department of Education! Henry was one of 46 schools to receive the designation. The school was recognized for meeting all state and federal accountability requirements for two consecutive years and exceeding 6oth-percentile SOL pass rates for reading and mathematics. Congratulations to the school's students, families, and staff—keep up the good work!

Kindergarten Information Sessions—Parents of rising kindergarten students should note that Arlington Public Schools hosted its annual countywide Kindergarten Information Night on Tuesday, January 19th, at Washington-Lee High School, and there will be two Patrick Henry-specific sessions held at the school on February 18th, from 9:15am–10:45am, and April 7th, from 12:45pm–2:15pm. Thomas Jefferson Middle School also held its annual Middle School Information Night on Thursday, January 21st. # South Arlington's Acoustic Café Launches Spring Season

There aren't many venues on Columbia Pike that have live music...and there are even fewer that provide a beautiful listening environment that both musicians and audiences appreciate. We have one right here in our neighborhood. The Walter Reed Recreation Center at Walter Reed and 16th St. S has a new program that showcases local musicians in a relaxed setting, dedicated to listening. It's called the Acoustic Café, and it happens on the third Tuesday of the month, in the spring and fall.

After a winter break, the Acoustic Café opens its 2016 season on Tuesday, March 15th with a lineup headlined by Martinez & Guthrie. This duo features the vocals of Douglas Park resident Gus Guthrie. You may have seen Gus at the 4th of July picnic with his band NoBetterOff... or Sunday mornings at the Farmer's Market. He teams up with songwriter, producer and multi-instrumentalist Joe Martinez, playing the original folk-pop that has landed them on Sirius/XM satellite radio, as well as numerous placements in TV shows and movies.

The next café takes place on April 19th, and it will feature the Dandelion Gang. The Gang has worked up a set of classic Dixie Chicks cover songs, with great vocals, fiddle and Douglas Park's own Rebecca Krafft picking the five wire (aka the 5-string banjo).

May 17 and June 21 are the next two dates, followed by a summertime hiatus.

The music starts at 7pm and runs til 8:30. Each evening consists of two opening acts, plus the featured band. Light refreshments – cookies and coffee – are available.

So check out the Acoustic Café, and support (really) local music...fresh from our own neighborhood. And if you are a musician looking for audience, the Acoustic Café is for you.

## What I Do to Sell a Listing

I try **every avenue available** to get the home sold at the **highest price possible**. I do not spread myself too thin by taking too many listings and then waiting for other agents to sell them. I take fewer and give them my **undivided attention** and frequently **sell them myself**.

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I take my own **photos** and compile a **listing brochure** and also an **extensive narrative**. I answer all my "**sign calls**" and I hold my own open houses. Both are great ways to sell a house and since I know the house better than some assistant, I frequently **sell it**.

My husband and I work together as a **team** and handle all **facets** of the **listing**. We do not delegate it out to an assistant. We **stage** the house and **advise** and **coordinate** the repairs. We **measure** all rooms and insert them into the **MRIS** and other **databases** for **agents** and **buyers**. Some agents do not bother to do this. We work **endlessly** for the seller and subsequent **buyers**. We try to be as THOROUGH as we possibly can be.
