As you can see from former treasurer Al Fox's financial recap on p 3, the Association managed to keep our books on a fairly steady level over the course of the pandemic. The generosity of you and your fellow Douglas Park residents brought in nearly forty-five hundred dollars in our annual Holiday Drive...more than we've ever raised before. Those dollars brought warm smiles and much-needed gifts to neighborhood residents who were hit hard by the economic effects of the pandemic. We also unexpectedly decreased our expenditures due to the pandemic-related cancellations of our annual Fourth of July and Trail of Terror events.

Unfortunately, also declined revenues Membership dues and additional contributions were down 37% over the prior fiscal year. While we pared the budget last year, this decline in revenue will begin to impact us as the county lifts restrictions on events, which we anticipate later in 2021.
