Columbia Pike Partnership: The Columbia Pike Revitalization Organization (CPRO) is now known as the Columbia Pike Partnership (CPP)! The group celebrated its 35th anniversary at an outdoor gala at Penrose Square on the evening of October 14, 2021, and unveiled its new name and brand at the event. CPP is a community group that engages in advocacy for the businesses and residents along Columbia Pike and also puts on community events, such as the annual Blues Fest (in June). The Civic Association has been a long-time member of CPP. Congratulations to Douglas Park's own John Snyder, the CPP Board Chair, and CPP Board Members and staff for a successful celebration! Neighborhood Conservation: At the last Civic Association meeting on September 20, 2021, the neighborhood unanimously approved our draft updated Neighborhood Conservation Plan, which has been submitted to County Staff for comment. We expect to present the Plan to the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee later in November and the Planning Commission in early December, with acceptance by the County Board at their December meeting. Thank you again to all who have contributed to this important effort!

Randolph PTA Update

andolph students and staff were excited to return to 5-day-**\bigcap** a-week in person school this year. As some Randolph students have chosen to participate in the APS virtual learning program, the school administration and PTA are working hard to integrate our virtual families into communications and community events. The Randolph PTA Food Pantry has evolved from a weekly outdoor food distribution to an indoor resource that any Randolph family (inperson or virtual) can access after dismissal each day. We've served about 20-30 families a week since opening our indoor pantry this fall. The PTA also is sponsoring 5 large outdoor distributions throughout the school year. Our first outdoor distribution was on Friday, October 15th, and we served more than 120 Randolph families with fresh fruits and vegetables, toiletries & cleaning supplies, pantry staples and snacks for kids. We continue to enjoy a partnership with La Cocina VA providing meals for our families.

In October, Randolph students participated in a spare change drive to support PathForward (formerly known as A-SPAN), an organization that serves the homeless community in Arlington and Alexandria. Students at each grade level had discussions in the classroom about this work and partnered on the schoolwide campaign. As an International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years Programme School, Randolph works to develop caring global citizens who work to influence and change the world around them.

Later this year, the PTA hopes to support scholarships to grow and expand Randolph's after school enrichment options and programs for our students.
