The Columbia Pike corridor has been suffering from a streak of graffiti incidents over the last several months. Vandals have plagued Columbia Pike on private and public property and the Arlington county Police Department has not been able to apprehend the suspects so far. The good news is that Arlington county is aware of the problem and is taking steps to address the graffiti. There is a new reporting process that residents can report graffiti to get it cleaned up. Anyone is able to go to the graffiti reporting website and report incidents (https://www.arlingtonva.us/Government/ **Departments/Police-Department/Graffiti**). The pictures above show graffiti at the pavilion in front of the South Glebe Road Post Office, and how the post office was cleaned up promptly after the graffiti was reported through the website. The Columbia Pike Partnership was able to work with civic associations along Columbia Pike and Arlington County to secure funding for private property graffiti removal, detection, and deterrence initiatives. If anyone has information on the identities of the vandals please report it to the Arlington county Police Department.

SITE TO BECOME INTERIM PARKING LOT

\/ou Soon will notice a change along Columbia Pike in our ■ neighborhood – the old SunTrust bank building at 3108 Columbia Pike will be getting torn down and be transformed into a temporary parking lot beginning in late fall 2023. The location is nestled between the Audi dealership and the brand new ParCiti golf simulator and restaurant. This will allow workers to park there during the day as the Arlington Public School Career Center undergoing construction over the next several years. After the completion of the career center, Arlington County will decide what new facility will be built on the property. Many residents over the years have been calling for this to be the site of a new Columbia Pike Library, the County is considering it to be the potential site for the Library, along with other County Board priorities such as affordable housing, and will develop a public engagement process about its future once the career center construction is complete.

Over the last several years, Arlington County tore down the original 1924 group home and has rebuilt a state-of-the art, sustainable home at 1212 South Irving Street. Construction is now complete and the home is completing permitting to house up to six individuals with developmental and physical disabilities across their lifespans, regardless of physical and behavioral support needs. Neighbors were welcomed to an open house to check out the brand new group home. The home also boasts several environmentally friendly features including geothermal heating and cooling, energy efficient windows and appliances,





40th Annual Holiday Fund Drive Kickoff
