Traffic Is an Ongoing Concern

DPCA Meeting, Tues., May 18, 7:30pm

County Staff to Discuss Traffic Signal at 12th and Glebe

Based on a consultant's report, the county recommends the installation of a traffic signal at the post office at Glebe Rd. and 12th St., and adding improved pedestrian crossings across Glebe between Walter Reed and 12th St. The study was commissioned following DPCA's request at our Sept 17, 2003, meeting with the county, and the call for the original study was contained in the plan for the current post office, approved some 10 years ago.

Traffic Concerns Persist on Monroe St.

While speeds on Monroe have been reduced because of the speed cushions, there are still problems with vehicles crossing the center line to avoid the cushions, and drivers running the stop sign on 14th St. Two more accidents have occurred at Monroe and 14th Sts. in the past month—on the evening of May 4 and the morning of April 12.

Arlington Co. staff has agreed to review problems and promised to make yet another study to see if the intersection qualifies for a 4-way stop. This may take up to 60 days due to volume of current requests for traffic studies. They will also work on solving the problem of vehicles using the emergency vehicle cuts to avoid crossing the speed humps.

Other Monroe St. traffic calming plans include additional speed cushions, gateways, textured crosswalks, and nubs that have yet to be constructed, in efforts to further reduce speed. —Bob Cowan, acting traffic committee chair
