FIVE FAMILIES HELPED THROUGH ANNUAL EFFORT

tis always a rewarding experience to be involved in the Douglas Park Civic Association Holiday Fund Drive. This program, which has been an integral part of DPCA annual activities for over 20 years, is designed to give a hand to needy families at Randolph Elementary School. Each year, DPCA works with the counselor and teachers at the school to identify families who are in severe financial need. Neighbors generously contribute their time, money and efforts to help these families. This year, we reached five families, with a total of six adults and ten children, ages 4 through 16. Because of the generosity of DPCA members, the immediate burden on these families was significantly eased and the holiday season was made brighter.

All families received many gifts, including necessities and special treats. The children were given clothes, underwear, pajamas, socks, coats, and shoes. In addition there were books, toys, games and other wish list items. Parents accepted coats and household goods such as towels, pots and pans and dishes. The families were very grateful for the gifts and sent thank you cards to express their appreciation. The sentiments included: 'Many thanks for the presents that you sent. This Christmas is going to be a precious one for my daughter and me!' 'Thank you so much for choosing us to receive the presents! It means so much to my family!' and 'Thank you for the gifts. This is the first time I ever received presents!'

We collected just under \$3,000 in donations, which covered our costs with a little to bank for next year. Thank you to everyone who so generously contributed. Thanks to Randolph counselor Jennifer Bullen, Bi-lingual Resource Assistant Jackie Garcia, and other staff members who identified the families, collected wish lists, and ascertained sizes to assist the shoppers. Thanks to Debbie Hill, Susan Rochard, Irene Witting, Molly Schnure, and Rita Wiggins who shopped for and wrapped presents. Thanks to Marian MacGilray who helped with wrapping presents. Thanks go out to all those who helped with preparation of fliers and envelopes, to the dedicated newsletter deliverers, and a final, special appreciation to DPCA president John Snyder and treasurer Al Fox who are an essential part of every success that DPCA realizes. I am very proud to be a part of such a generous and caring community!

NEXT CIVIC ASSOCIATION MEETING

The next civic association meeting will be Tuesday 26 February at 7.3 opm it Café Sazon, 4704 Columbia Pike, next to Goodwill. On the agenda:

- Four Mile Run and the Pike—Dumpsters. I must confess continued irritation that the gateway to Douglas Park eastbound on the Pike is the recycling dumpsters. Nothing against recycling, but now that we do it at curbside in our handy blue bins, do we really need to devote a key spot in the heart of Arlington's most important community to trash? Shall we ask the county to move the dumpsters? And what should be there instead? Connection with the bike path? A small park? Let's decide what we would like to see. With construction ongoing there, now would be the time to decide what to do next.
- Twelfth Street Between Glebe and Walter Reed. Our 12th Street South neighbors have been engaged with the county about how to mitigate traffic concerns with the coming Pike 3400 building next to the Post Office. Should it be one way? Parking on only one side? Launch a sidewalk project through the Neighborhood Conservation program? Let's continue the conversation.
- Civic Association form of organization. It seems our civic association should, as many other such organizations do, get ourselves properly registered with the IRS. We could be a 501(c)(4) organization. This means we are not-for-profit (for sure!) so that we will not have to pay taxes as an organization. However, it is not a charitable organization, so contributions to the civic association would not be tax deductible. It allows us to engage in advocacy, which is one of our core missions. Let's decide this.
- **Elections.** Tuesday will be election night. Nominations are open for all offices: President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. If you would like information about the role of each, please contact John Snyder at *jvsnyder54@comcast.net*.

Improvements are coming to the path from George Mason Drive to Randolph School, including lighting for those early morning and evening walks during dark winter months. The project was approved through the Neighborhood Conservation program. Construction may be completed by the end of the year.


