- **Neighborhood Conservation.** We discussed and voted on our next project to submit to the Neighborhood Conservation queue. The assembled membership voted for the next project to be curb, gutter and sidewalk improvements along 18th St S from S Quincy to S Nelson St.

OTHER NEIGHBORHOOD UPDATES:

BIKE AND MULTIUSE TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS BETWEEN W&OD AND FOUR MILE RUN TRAILS.

County staff has recently presented an updated set of plans for improving the trail connections between the W&OD and Four Mile Run Trails along S Walter Reed Drive. The plan includes grade-separated 10-ft wide trails along either side of S Walter Reed Drive and numerous driveway, crosswalk and signalling improvements. The project is scheduled to go to bid next spring with construction commencing in the second half of 2016. Learn more about the planned (and much-needed) improvements here:

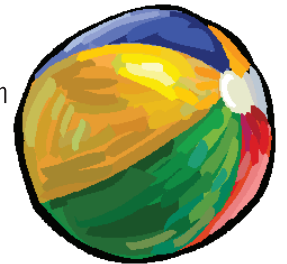

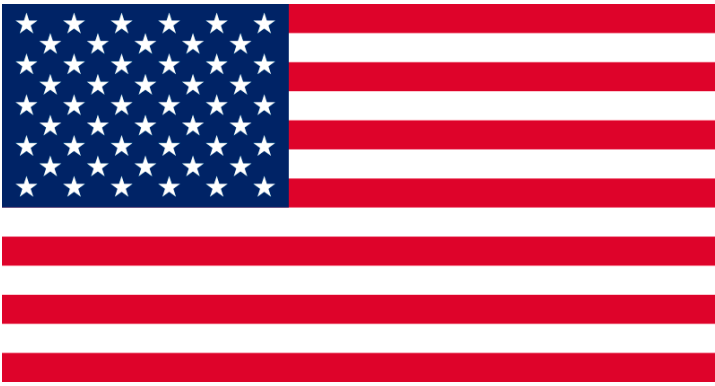
sno-cones.
