UPDATE ON 12th St S NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION PROJECT UPDATE

On 3 April, DPCA and county staff held an evening meeting for residents of South 12th St between S Highland St and Glebe Rd to review the plans and drawings for our next Neighborhood Conservation project. The project then went to 'Final Petition' where all residents in the project area vote on whether to proceed.

The project FAILED final petitioning: 55.9% FOR and 44.1% AGAINST the project, based on the total linear frontage. Out of 34 properties, there were 12 yes votes, 15 noes and 7 non-responses.

These homeowners are seeing electric and natural gas bills that are about \$615 per year lower than they were prior to the renovation, even though they typically added about 1,000 square feet to their homes during the renovation process.

Homeowners living in new Green Home Choice homes save about \$1,580 per year on their electricity and natural gas bills compared to other Arlington homes of the same size. These Green Home Choice homes are using 42% less energy per square foot than the typical Arlington home.

Four Tips to Get Rid of Mosquitoes in Your Yard

Mosquitoes suck! The abundant (or over-abundant) rains that we've received the past few weeks have certainly created lots of pockets of standing water. The mosquitoes are about to take over once the heat arrives. As if buzzing and bites aren't enough, mosquitoes can transmit a number of infectious diseases, a fact that elevates the insects from a nuisance to an outright health risk.

Hiring a pest management company to spray or fog your yard can be temporarily effective on adult mosquitos, but they don't impact the millions of mosquito eggs that are in your flower pot dish, gutters, downspouts, ivy, etc. Also, most of the sprays, even if labeled 'natural', may be harmful to other beneficial insects and children.

Here are a few no-nonsense tips for keeping mosquitoes out of your yard and away from your

- **1. Get Rid of Standing Water**

Mosquitoes reproduce in water and they can do it in even the small amount of water that would fit in a bottle cap.

That means it's imperative to empty flower pot trays, kids toys, buckets, tarps, tires, wheelbarrows, or other outdoor gear that can catch water after a rainfall. Gutters and those corrugated downspout extensions are notorious breeding grounds for mosquitoes. Attach panty hose, yes panty hose, to the end of the corrugated drain lines with a rubber band. This will keep mosquitos from getting in and breeding.

In a mere four days, eggs laid in water mature into nymphs. So if it rains on a Monday, don't wait until the weekend to get rid of standing water. By then, it'll be too late.

- **2. Keep Your Yard Under Control**

Mosquitoes favor cooler spots in the shade especially ivy and taller grass. Use a lawn mower or string trimmer to cut back high grass, brush, and tree limbs.

By minimizing any tall grass or limbs that cast shadows on your yard, you make the habitat immediately surrounding your home much less appealing to mosquitoes.

- **3. Use Fans Even Outdoors**

We've all heard of citronella candles. Believe it or


not, fans are actually more effective. The terrible tiger mosquitos have a difficult time flying against the breeze of a fan. Fans also help disperse carbon dioxide emitted by humans, which is what attracts them in the first place. Oscillating fans can be helpful for your yard.

- **4. Keep Covered and Use Repellent**

As much as the above steps will help cut down on mosquitoes in your own yard, controlling the greater population requires targeted community efforts. Even if you follow these tips, your neighbor's yard might be a breeding ground.

To guard against bites, wear long sleeves, use an effective insect repellent and avoid going outside at prime

feeding times—dawn and dusk. These safeguards can minimize your exposure, cutting your risk of mosquito-transmitted illness so you can enjoy the outdoors with more peace of mind.


