2019 Holiday Fund Drive Recap

Thanks to all of you, the Douglas Park Civic Association Holiday Fund Drive, was a tremendous success again this year. This program, which has been going strong for thirty-six years and is an integral part of DPCA annual activities, gives a hand to needy families at Randolph Elementary School. Each year DPCA works with the counselor and teachers at the school to identify students/families who are in financial need. Neighbors generously contribute their time, money and efforts to help these families.

This year, we provided gifts for 40 children, aged one month to eleven years old. Upon request, parents completed lists of "wants" and "needs" for their little ones; we tried to make sure that all children received at least one item from each list. Lots of kids opened packages with warm clothes: pants, shirts, sweaters, shoes, boots and coats. The "fun" items included dolls, Legos, cars, trains, balls, art materials and slime .

We collected a total of \$3,165. With all the bills paid, we have an excess of \$600. We will use the extra money to purchase Harris Teeter grocery cards that will be given to the school to distribute as needed.

We had a wealth of volunteers this year. Fourteen shoppers and one additional wrapper demonstrated the truth of the adage, "Many hands make light work." Thank you to: Mina Stanard, Kate Miller, Emily King, Diane Shinn, Anna Arrowsmith, Irene Wittig, Sean Steele, Amy Creed, Marissa Solis, Shannon Taylor, Diana Robinson, Robyn McGinn, Lisa Lopez, and Taylor Cylke for their admirable shopping prowess. Gracias to Jessica Kaufman who shared her gift wrapping talents - much

to one of our shopper's relief! (We all have different skill sets!) Kudos to the neighbors who prepared the contribution envelopes as well as the newsletter carriers who distributed them (and Annette Pigott who has tirelessly organized that effort for years). Thanks to the outreach team at Randolph which is always a pleasure to work with. And finally, thanks to our stalwarts, DPCA Treasurer, Al Fox, and DPCA President, Adam Henderson, always working behind the scenes.

Some other things of interest in our and nearby neighborhoods:

- **As mentioned above, Annette Pigott is stepping aside as Douglas Park CA Secretary.** She is also passing on responsibilities as newsletter distribution co-ordinator. I am pleased to announce Bethany Zecher Sutton as our new newsletter distribution co-ordinator. Welcome Bethany!
- **Civic Association gradually moving to on-line transactions.** As we move to a new decade, the Civic Association board of directors has decided to move encouraging more online interactions. As part of that move, we encourage all members to pay their dues for the upcoming year (beginning 1 March) through our PayPal portal on our website at <http://www.douglasparkca.org/join/>.

PayPal is a safe and easy way to start or renew your membership and is used by an increasing number of your neighbors since we introduced it four years ago. If you prefer, you can still cut out the form at right and mail it in with your dues.

- **APRIL 1, 2020 IS CENSUS DAY!** The US Census counts every resident in the nation, including right here in Arlington County. As mandated by the US Constitution, America gets just one chance each decade to count its population. The collected data helps to determine things like the number of seats Virginia has in the House of Representatives, and how to distribute federal funds to local communities like ours. - **Jennie Dean Park.** The county board approved plans for the stage one redevelopment of Jennie Dean Park in Green Valley along Four Mile Run in November. Construction will begin this spring with completion planned for late 2021. See the phase one plans and follow the project at <https://projects.arlingtonva.us/projects/jennie-dean-park/>.
- **Jennie Dean Park, phase 2.** As part of phase two of the Jennie Dean Park redevelopment, the County continues to work toward finalizing an agreement with WETA-TV to move their production studios to a new facility adjacent to their Shirlington Headquarters on Campbell Avenue.
- **Four Mile Run Arts and Industry District.** As called for in the Four Mile Run Valley (4MRV) Master Plan adopted by the County Board in November 2018, a County-appointed Arts and Industry

- **Changes in Shirlington.** Our neighbors in Shirlington Civic Association are currently working through a General Land Use Plan [GLUP] update project for the Village at Shirlington. A key stance of their input is enhancing parking options in the Village to encourage evening activity in the Village. Douglas Park CA is supportive of the efforts. - **Columbia Pike Relocation at Arlington National Cemetery.** A public information meeting was held February 11th on the plan to realign Columbia Pike from S Oak St east to Washington Blvd (VA Rte 27). - Career Center Redevelopment.** Committee meetings on Arlington Public Schools expansion plans for the Career Center site along Walter Reed Drive just north of the Pike continue. A public information session on January 22d was well-attended with numerous residents encouraging robust parking facilities to accommodate the 2,000+ students and faculty anticipated for the site later this decade. As part of increasing space for students at the site, the Columbia Pike Branch Library will close temporarily this spring to retrofit the second floor space for classrooms. - Enhanced Speeding Fines on Neighborhood Streets.** In late January, the County Board approved a plan to increase speeding fines on certain residential streets by \$200. Once criteria and procedures are in place, the Civic Association will be looking to include streets such as 16th St S and S Quincy St in the program. - Pike West End Multi-Modal Improvements.** After a very rough implementation of lane closures along the Pike from Four Mile Run west to the Fairfax County line at the end of 2019, the Pike Presidents' Group (of which I am chair) and Columbia Pike Revitalization Organization [CPRO] have been meeting regularly with county staff (with some success) to improve access for resident and Pike businesses. We will continue to work with staff to mitigate impacts where possible as well as 'speed the pain' of the remaining sections of the Pike to be upgraded while prioritizing bus service and bus stop upgrades. Our goal is to press the county to have all improvements completed by late 2023 when the new Amazon HQ2 buildings at Metropolitan Park in Pentagon City come on line. The ramp up of Amazon HQ2 should enhance the success of Pike Corridor business.
